

Alignment of At-Home Activity Packets (Reading) to i-Ready Lessons

Dear Educator,

You may wish to extend the learning from i-Ready Personalized Instruction by blending the use of i-Ready online lessons with printable lessons from the At-Home Activity Packets available at www.i-ready.com/Athome. This approach has the added benefit of offering students a variety of online and offline learning experiences.

We have created this alignment document to facilitate mapping the concepts found in the printable packets to i-Ready Teacher-Assigned Lessons.* Here are some tips to keep in mind when blending packet lessons with online lessons:

- Use your discretion when **planning**:
 - The concepts covered in the At-Home Activity Packets, and in this alignment document, are not meant to represent a comprehensive blended curriculum. Consider the scope and sequence of your core reading curriculum when selecting concepts for students to focus on.
 - You can break larger concepts into multiple smaller assignments with fewer lessons and pages to complete than what is suggested in this Alignment Document.
 - When there are multiple i-Ready Teacher-Assigned Lessons suggested that align to a packet lesson, preview the i-Ready online lesson content and decide which lesson(s) make sense to assign to students.
 - When **assigning** work to students, we recommend having students complete the i-Ready lesson(s) before the aligned packet lesson, to prepare them for working independently.
 - When **communicating** with students and families, share the assignment plan in advance with suggested completion dates and times and be explicit about which concepts and skills students are learning and practicing.

Additional Notes/Tips:

- Aligned i-Ready lessons are at the same grade level as the Activity Packets and from a variety of domains; the domain is always listed first in the “Aligned i-Ready Lesson(s)” column.
- In Grades K-1, the reading passages and the comprehension questions are the same in the At-Home Activity packet and the i-Ready lesson. However, in the i-Ready lesson, students receive substantial instructional guidance and support and the passage is read aloud. By having students complete the i-Ready lesson before the packet lesson, you can scaffold students’ experience and ensure they are successful when working independently.
- The comprehension and vocabulary lessons take approximately 20 minutes. The Close Reading are significantly longer, up to 60 minutes, and can be completed in 3 sessions: one for the *Read to Understand* section, one for the *Read to Analyze* section, and one for *Read to Write*.
