














**Have children form groups of 6, 7, 8, and 9.** Review numbers 1 to 5 using dot cards, and then display the dot card for 6. Give 6 children paper plates and have them use the plates to make an arrangement of 6 on the floor. Repeat,

having other groups of 6 children make different arrangements. Then have children use counters to make arrangements of 6 on the workmat, counting to check that each arrangement shows 6. Repeat with 7, 8, and 9 counters.







**Children explore visual images of 10.** Children place 5 counters in a column of the 10-frame. Then they add counters one at a time to fill the frame,


counting to verify each time. Next, they move the counters to be around the edge of the circle. Ask: *How do you count objects in a circle?* 

## Prepare for Counting and Writing to 10



**Have children show the meaning of 8.** Have children fill in each of the boxes to show the meaning of 8. Tell children that they can use words, numbers, and pictures. Encourage them to show as many ideas as they can.






**Children explore visual images of 8.** Have children place 8 small objects on the 10-frame, one at a time, counting to verify each time.

Next, they move the objects to be around the edge of the circle. Ask: *How do you count objects in a circle?*

Children compare groups of 6 and 7 crayons and discuss how to identify the group that has more. Invite two children to the front of the class and give one child 6 crayons and the other 7 crayons. Ask: Which child


has more crayons? How do you know? Then have children use counters to model the problem and discuss how they can compare the number of counters without counting.




**Children compare groups of counters to see which has more.** Pair children and give each child a group of 5, 6, or 7 counters. Then ask children to compare the counters to find out which child has more or if they have the

same number of counters. Ask pairs to explain how they determined who has more. Then display 5 crayons in one hand and 7 crayons in the other. Ask: Which hand has more crayons? How do you know?

## **Prepare for Comparing Within 10**



**Have children show the meaning of the word** *less.* Have children fill in each of the boxes to show the meaning of the word *less.* Tell children that they can use words, numbers, and pictures. Encourage them to show as many ideas as they can.



**Children compare groups of objects to see which has fewer.** Give children some small objects. Have them put 3 objects on one workmat and 2 objects on the other workmat. Then ask children to compare the objects to find out which

workmat has fewer. Ask them to explain how they determined which has fewer. Then have them place 3 objects on one workmat and 4 objects on the other workmat. Ask: Which workmat has fewer objects? How do you know?
